Download and print this guide to pick the right ribbed trout worm color—plus smart backups—on every outing.

Seasonal Color Picks

Spring

Water Clarity	Single Color	Two-Tone Combo
Clear (>8 ft)	Peach	Root Beer
Stained (4–8 ft)	Pink	Olive & Cheese
Muddy (<4 ft)	Orange	Orange / White

Summer

Light Condition	Single Color	Two-Tone Combo
Bright Sun, Clear	Gold, White	Root Beer
Overcast or Stained	Chartreuse, Red	Black & Cheese
Deep Holes (>8 ft)	Red, Chartreuse	Root Beer

Fall

Habitat	Single Color	Two-Tone Combo	
Riffles & Shallows	Peach, Gold	Olive & Cheese	
Deep Pools	Red, Nightcrawler	Black & Cheese	
Transition Zones	White, Mint Green	Root Beer	



Winter

Light Condition	Single Color	Two-Tone Combo
Low-Light Nights	Nightcrawler, Black	Black & Cheese
Daylight, Clear	White, Gold	Root Beer
Icy Runs & Holes	Red, Chartreuse	Orange / White

Visual-Cue Substitution

If your ideal shade is unavailable, choose backups by matching the dominant cue:

Visual Cue	Primary Color	1st Substitute	2nd Substitute
Silhouette Contrast	Nightcrawler	Black	Red
Flash / Reflection	Gold	White	Root Beer
UV Attractor Pop	Chartreuse	Pink	Orange
Natural Hatch Match	Peach	Mint Green	Translucent Brown
Deep-Water Visibility	Red	Nightcrawler	Black / Red

How to Use

- 1. Check season, water clarity, light, depth, and local forage.
- 2. Pick the **Single Color** or **Two-Tone Combo** from the Seasonal table.
- 3. If you don't have it, use the **Visual-Cue Substitution** table to select 1st and 2nd backups.
- 4. Rig identically and fish 3–5 casts before switching to the next substitute.
- 5. Log your results: condition, color, catch rate. Update your cheat sheet notes.
